Hi everyone,


We had a great banquet/change of watch, one month early. At least the shelter gave us protection from the light rain.

Book Review

A 3 to 5 hour race up to Menasha is much to write about, but challenging another sailor to a single hander race around the world can create enough verbiage to publish a 187 page book on the subject.
